# Bletsoe Peals

# Wednesday, 17th October 1888

Not a peal, but worthy of mention, being the first known record of *method* ringing at Bletsoe.

"Five members of the Sharnbrook Company paid a visit to Bletsoe, and rang on the bells of the parish church two six scores of plain Bob and three six scores of Grandsire Doubles, each called differently by the following, A J Barcock, E Coleman, J Dickens, W Page, L Bell. This was rung as a compliment to Mr Frederick Haines. the parish clerk, it being his 50th year as a ringer." (Bedfordshire Mercury, October 27th, 1888)

A sixth bell, the treble and named Eleanor, was added in 1900 in memory of the widow of StAndrew, 14th Baron StJohn of Bletsoe.
