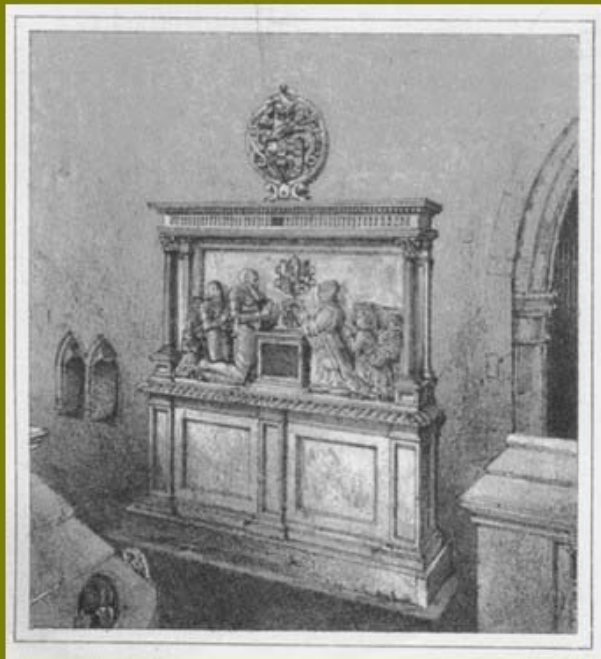


Squint

from chantry chapel
to chancel altar

1279: *Nicholas de Sarnebroc' priest
presented by John de Pateshull to a
chantry in the chapel lately founded*

1379: *Sir Roger de Beauchamp wills
£100 to endow "my (old) chantry"*



The small picture shows the 16th century St John Memorial in its original position in the St John Chapel (north transept) before its removal to the nave which revealed blocked features in the stonework forming part of a squint from the original medieval chantry chapel giving a view of the altar in the original half-length chancel
