On the retirement of Henry Campion, aged 81, the lease of Bletsoe Castle Farm was relinquished and the remaining live and dead stock sold at auction. The lease could well have passed to his eldest son, Edward, who held the Bourne End and Strawberry Hill (Knotting) farms had he not died prematurely the previous year. Henry retired to Bedford with two of his unmarried daughters, Louise and Emily. It seems that Henry had subsequently proposed to farm Bourne End in partnership with his youngest son, Frank, but was persuaded to retire by his eldest daughter Louise.
