Warrant Signed by Sir Robert Carey, chamberlain to the Prince of Wales, authorising payment of 21 shillings and 4 pence to Hugh Bowes, yeoman of the Prince's wardrobe, for his expenses in moving all the Prince's effects from **Bletsoe** to [Castle] Ashby in the summer of 1619.

The journey recorded in this warrant took Bowes and his team of labourers six days.

Robert Carey, first Earl of Monmouth (1560-1639), was a fashionable courtier in the reigns of Elizabeth I and James I, and the author of Memoirs. He was governor of the household of Prince Charles, later King Charles I, from 1605. When Charles became Prince of Wales, Carey was appointed his chamberlain.
